# Questions and Statements from the floor (attending schools) -

- Avondale College, Simon (Tutor): wants to know why the rule is that Co-ed schools have to perform on Friday this year. We should've alternated from the previous year's day performance and that we agreed unanimously to switch for this year.
- Mele, Komiti: It was already set that the rotation of co-ed schools and single sex schools would only happen every two years. That this year being the second year, co-ed schools will again start on Friday and then on Saturday the competition would start with the Boys schools first then followed by the Girls schools.
- Waitakere College, Wes (T.I.C): Supports the switching of rotation to single sex schools this year performing on Friday and Co-ed schools on Saturday
- McAuley High School, Tauanuu Sealiimalietoa Perenise Tapu (T.I.C): Clearly sees the issue, its the day. Suggests to keep the alternative to keep things clear. Pinpoints the issue its clearly the day not the time.
- Toesulu, Komiti: Schools need to remember that Co-ed schools far outnumber single sex schools
- Mele, Komiti: This issue was raised before and discussed. There is clearly not enough time slots for schools because on Saturday we need to finish by 4:30pm. We cannot please everybody. The Komiti did not make the decision, it was voted on by the schools that were present at the time.
- Avondale College, Simon (Tutor): We need to ensure fairness in the "mysterious draw". There is a need for a constitutional to entrench this. There should be a compromise.
- Mele, Komiti: Next year single sex schools will be on Friday, and Co-eds on Saturday if there is enough time slots on Saturday. Girls schools will begin performing on Friday, followed by Boys schools.
- Kelston Girls College as the host school will perform last on Saturday this year.
